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MESSAGE FROM DR. JIMMEKA ANDERSON, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



As I reflect on the extraordinary year we've had at Black Girls Film Camp, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude for the strides we've made together. The 2023-2024 year was one of transformation, collaboration, and significant achievements. It was a year where we not only strengthened our foundation but also soared to new heights, all while staying true to our mission of empowering Black girls through film.

One of our most important milestones this year was the defining and solidifying of our core values as an organization. This was not just a process of words but a journey of collaboration involving our Board of Directors, Alumni Collective, and Leadership Team. Through thoughtful discussions and workshops, we identified six core values that now guide everything we do. These values are the heartbeat of our organization, ensuring that our mission remains aligned with our vision, whether within our team or as we engage with the broader film and creative communities.

This year, our accomplishments have been truly remarkable. We have now produced 40 films by incredibly talented teen girls, adding vibrant stories to the world.

Our community has blossomed into a thriving network of over 260 Black girls and women creatives. Our films have been screened at more than 90 festivals, events, and universities, inspiring audiences far and wide. We've hosted over 250 workshops and learning experiences, providing invaluable education and mentorship. Our digital presence continues to grow with over 125,000 views on social media and streaming platforms. Our alumni have been recognized with 40 individual film selections, 10 honorable mentions, and 10 film awards. Our digital community now boasts over 25,000 supporters who believe in the power of Black girl storytelling. And perhaps one of our proudest achievements: we have a 90% film school acceptance rate among our alumni.

This year, our partnerships have also been nothing short of phenomenal. NBC Universal welcomed us to their LA lot during our retreat, providing a customized tour and an inspiring Fireside Chat with industry leaders Pearlena Igbokwe and Nne Ebong. The Sony Create Action Grant provided each participant in this year's cohort with a Sony camera to keep. We also had the honor of partnering with USC Annenberg's Critical Media Project for our 3rd Annual LA Production retreat, collaborating with Dr. Alison Trope and Miki Turner. Our films were spotlighted at the Essence Film Festival for the second year, and I had the privilege of speaking on a panel with other AMAZING media organization leaders.

But there is more! We have raised over \$1 million in financial contributions to date, fueling our mission and programs. We received a new grant from the Surdna Foundation, a new multi-year grant from the MacArthur Foundation, and increased funding from the Ms. Foundation, Arts and Science Council, and Ally. BGFC was also hosted by the California Film Institute at the 46th Mill Valley Film Festival, where our alumni screened their films and I had the honor of receiving the Vision In Film Education Award during the Mind The Gap Summit.

None of this would have been possible without the unwavering support of our incredible Board of Directors, our dedicated Leadership Team, our Alumni Collective, and our passionate partners. Together, we are creating a legacy of Black girl storytellers who are changing the face of the film industry.

MESSAGE FROM SIERRA DAVIS, FINANCE/OPERATIONS DIRECTOR



Black Girls Film Camp (BGFC) has had an extraordinary fourth year of programming. Through the generosity of foundation grants, sponsorships, fundraising efforts, and individual donors, we secured an impressive \$488k in income and \$58k in inkind donations for Fiscal Year 2024. A substantial 89% of our income came from our incredible grantors, with fundraising initiatives contributing 9% and sponsorships adding 2%. Notably, our annual Giving Tuesday campaign raised \$20k, complemented by \$10.6k from corporate and individual donations. Additional funding was generated through our BGFC store, which also saw significant growth this year, member dues, and event ticket sales. The funds raised have been instrumental in supporting the programs and services we offer.

Thanks to the contributions from our generous donors and internal funding, we were able to provide a free and exceptional camp experience to 10 highschool girls from across the nation for a fourth year. Each participant received all necessary camp supplies and a dedicated production team consisting of a production coach and an editor. The teen directors were equipped with SONY cameras, boom mics, lighting kits, and a film production budget. This year, we were thrilled to offer inperson opportunities once again, including an all-expense-paid weekend retreat at USC in Los Angeles, CA, and an in-person screening and awards showcase held

at the NASCAR Hall of Fame in Charlotte, NC. Additionally, we were fortunate to fund alumni coaches to attend the LA production retreat, creating a space for our teen directors to connect with their cohort, production teams, and BGFC alumni. These enriching experiences were made possible by the unwavering support of our community.

BGFC has also made significant strides in operational growth. For the third consecutive year, we maintained efficiency by contracting a select team to manage program planning and implementation as coordinators. This approach has been instrumental to our operational success. We contracted 20 production coaches and editors to guide our teen directors, along with supervisors overseeing pre-production, production, and post-production phases. Their involvement in the filmmaking process was vital to the successful development of the teen directors' films. We also contracted professional cinematographers, which greatly enhanced the quality of each teen director's film.

Looking ahead, we are committed to further advancing our organization. The coordinator roles over the past three years have been invaluable, and we believe that maintaining and expanding these positions will continue to progress the organization. As we approach our fifth year, we aim to introduce production coordinator roles to enhance the production process. This past year, we were able to increase each teen director's production budget, supporting filmmaking needs such as props, costumes, and cinematography. We are dedicated to implementing more enhancements like these to help each girl realize her vision. Finally, we are focused on growing our Outreach and Alumni Program to create more internal leadership opportunities and support film screenings, scholarships, and film festival submissions for our teen director alumni.

We are excited for another thriving year ahead and hope to have your continued support in making it successful!

THE HOW

Curriculum


We create safe spaces for Black girls to build critical media literacy skills, construct their own narratives centering on Black girlhood, and share their stories through film with the world with an industry standard curriculum.

Co-Creation

We implement an intergenerational co-creation model to develop THE GIRL, document HER/THEIR story, disseminate HER/THEIR film, and deconstruct harmful narratives through cocreated dialogic community spaces with universities, festivals, and organizations.

Collaboration

We partner with production studios, award-winning filmmakers, festivals, and TV/Film industry influencers to provide an immersive experience in Hollywood, personalized coaching, and a creative community to support Black girls to develop their stories into films.



THE ANNUAL NATIONAL CAMP

BGFC provides a FREE, national (USA), and hybrid 16-week experience (held once a year) where high school girls across the country pitch a story idea, and a final ten are selected to have their short film project produced by the program. The camp is an incubator for the 10 girls and each of their films. Participants receive free technology (SONY Cameras, lighting kits, boom mics, tripods, etc.) free software (final draft and adobe premiere), a personal production team of exemplary women creatives (editor, production coach, and alumni coach) contracted out by the camp, an all-expense paid weekend retreat in LA, and free workshops from award-winning filmmakers and Ph.D. scholars. Films created by the teen girls and their production teams debut during a Premiere Weekend in the summer. Following the 16-week camp, alumni participate in local, national, and international outreach events throughout the year to share their stories with the world and support other aspiring young youth filmmakers.

BGFC ESTABLISHES CORE VALUES FOR HOW WE SERVE, CREATE, AND WORK

This year, Black Girls Film Camp made significant strides in defining and solidifying our core values as an organization. Through a collaborative process involving our Board of Directors, Alumni Collective, and Leadership Team, we engaged in thoughtful discussions and workshops to identify the six core values that guide our mission and operations. These values not only reflect our commitment to empowering Black girls in film but also serve as the foundation for our strategic initiatives, program development, and community partnerships. By embedding these values into the fabric of our organization, we ensure that our work remains aligned with our vision, both internally within our team and externally in the broader film and creative communities.

1. Narrative Change

We advocate for Narrative Change to challenge and transform the dominant stories told about Black girls that are limited, harmful, and perpetuate systems of oppression.

2. Storytelling

We implement Storytelling to ensure Black girls' voices are heard and their experiences are authentically portrayed through their own unique narratives.

3. Joy

We prioritize Joy as a value to celebrate the diverse culture of Black girlhood, while creating spaces where our happiness and well-being are central to our work.

4. Representation

We strive for Representation to amplify diverse images and voices of Black girls in film and media, behind and in front of the camera, to ensure we see ourselves reflected in past, present, and future narratives.

5. Community

We embrace Community and Sisterhood to build a supportive, intergenerational network that nurtures collaboration, learning, and growth.

6. Access

We create Access by providing the tools, resources, and opportunities necessary to succeed in the Film Industry.

We are so proud of our alumni and their achievements this year! BGFC Alumni continued their journey with BGFC by attending curated events featuring esteemed filmmakers, gaining information on how to submit to festivals, celebrating college acceptances, participating in screening opportunities and panel discussions as well as encouragement on honing their craft and creative voice.

This year, we implemented our first Alumni Awards & Induction Ceremony, honoring our previous alumni for their years of service with gifts, awarding the inaugural Sisterhood award to Avery Kelley (2023) and providing the awardee with a \$500 creative investment. We also formally inducted our 2024 Teen Directors with a ceremony officially welcoming them to the BGFC Alumni.

- Marley Noel (2022) (Pictured Bottom Left) had her film "Uke," which was created in the 2022 Black Girls Film Camp, selected as a finalist in the Reel HBCU Film Festival hosted by the National Black Movie Association. Marley attended the event in DC and received the 2nd place award along with scholarship money in the national competition.
- Jessica Johnson (2021) participated in an internship with the Delta Center for Culture and Learning at Delta State University, where she worked with the MS Delta Cultural Heritage Ambassadors' Program to create the Documentary Short film, Delta Narratives. She worked as lead editor and Co-DP for the documentary series and co-creative directed the project.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

In Fiscal Year 2024, Black Girls Film Camp (BGFC) secured \$488k in funding through foundation grants, fundraising efforts, and sponsorships, surpassing our initial goal of \$400k. This marks a \$145.1k increase from the previous year. In addition, BGFC received in-kind donations from SONY and Final Draft valued at \$50k and \$8k, respectively. The 2024 camp year was predominantly funded by foundation grants, with significant contributions from the MacArthur Foundation (\$150k) and the Surdna Foundation (\$45k). These funds enabled us to provide 10 teen girls with essential filmmaking tools, including cameras, lighting kits, boom mics, tripods, and free software (Final Draft). We also supported 20 contractors who served as Production Coaches and Editors for each teen's production team and organized an all-expenses-paid weekend retreat at USC in Los Angeles, CA, covering hotel, flights, and meals. Additionally, the funding facilitated our annual premiere weekend and awards showcase, the marketing of the new 2024 films, supervisor and coordinator salaries, and administrative costs. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, 2024 was a year of remarkable impact.

Looking ahead, our goal is to diversify our funding sources more evenly across grants, corporate sponsorships, and fundraising. While our fundraising revenue increased by 24% compared to 2023, foundation grants constituted 89% of our funding for the 2024 fiscal year. We are committed to securing more foundation and multi-year grants, expanding our fundraising efforts, and generating revenue through programming to establish a sustainable funding stream. Your continued support is crucial in enabling us to provide such dynamic programming experiences for our participants. We look forward to advancing the mission of BGFC with the ongoing support of all our donors.





NEW POST PRODUCTION PLATFORMS INTRODUCED + BGFC EDITORS HIRED THROUGH EDITBAE POST

We enhance post-production education each year using Adobe Suites Premiere Pro and After Effects as our editing platform. The biggest learning curve and focus of this cohort was sound design. Using Envato Elements, students understood the power of music, sound effects, and transitional techniques. Frame.io served as our client relations platform to give precise visual feedback. Award-winning film editor Stephanie Filo, ACE (Dahmer, Black Lady Sketch Show, We Grown Now) and Spencer Reich (Power Universe, Diarra from Detroit) provided deeper insight and inspiration with their professional journey. While partnering with Editbae Post, we've been able to hire BGFC editors for various high-end projects to build a pipeline into the workforce.
